

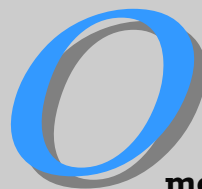

- ◆ Work with PTA/PTOs on activities that help link what is happening at school with learning at home.

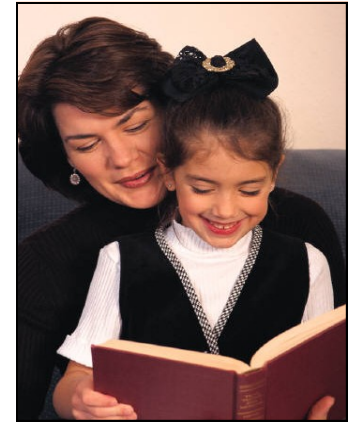
